
Numeracy Learning Progression

Learning basic skills like reading, writing, spelling, adding and subtracting generally happens in a certain order. On the Australian Curriculum website, the Literacy and Numeracy Progressions show the order in which most children develop these skills.

Use the Literacy and Numeracy Progressions to see where your child might be up to in their development of a particular skill (like learning to tell the time) and see the next typical step of development.

Counts the money in their money box. Gives back change in different ways for the same amount.

Decides if they have enough money to purchase several different items.

Solves problems, such as how much online subscription fees will cost over a year, using multiplicative strategies.

How your child learns to use money



Identifies situations that involve the use of money.

Counts collections of coins and writes the values as dollars or as cents.

Represents different money values in multiple ways.

Calculates the cost of several items and the change required.

Connects money to decimal notation and uses multiplicative strategies to solve problems involving money.
